### **Crochet Motif Pattern For Lace Back Cardigan** Sweater With Scarf Like Front Drape



If you're a crochet enthusiast looking for a new project that combines style, elegance, and warmth, then you've come to the right place. - Tapestry Needle: You'll need a tapestry needle to weave in loose ends and sew the motifs together.
- Scissors: A pair of sharp scissors will be handy for cutting yarn.

#### **Creating the Crochet Motif Pattern**

Now that you have your materials ready, it's time to start creating the crochet motif pattern:

- 1. Start with a foundation chain of 6 stitches. Slip stitch into the first chain to form a ring.
- Round 1: Chain 3 (acts as the first double crochet), then work 23 double crochets into the ring. Slip stitch into the third chain of the beginning chain 3 to join.
- Round 2: Chain 5 (acts as the first double crochet and chain 2). \*Skip the next stitch, double crochet in the next stitch, chain 2.\* Repeat from \* to \* around. Slip stitch into the third chain of the beginning chain 5 to join.
- 4. Round 3: Slip stitch into the next chain 2 space. Chain 5 (acts as the first double crochet and chain 2). \*Double crochet in the same chain 2 space, chain 2.\* Repeat from \* to \* in each chain 2 space around. Slip stitch into the third chain of the beginning chain 5 to join.
- 5. Repeat Round 3 until your motif reaches the desired size. You can make as many motifs as required to fit your measurements.

Note: This is just a basic guide for the crochet motif pattern. Feel free to experiment with different stitch combinations and variations to achieve your desired look.

#### Assembling the Cardigan Sweater

Once you have created enough motifs, it's time to assemble them into a cardigan sweater. Follow these steps:

 Lay out the motifs on a flat surface, arranging them in the desired pattern for the back and front of the cardigan.

- 2. Using a tapestry needle and matching yarn, sew the motifs together, joining them at the sides and shoulders.
- 3. Leave the armholes open, as they will be added later.

Note: You can customize the shape and size of your cardigan by adjusting the number of motifs used and their placement.

#### Completing the Sweater with Scarf-Like Front Drape

Now that you have your lace back cardigan sweater assembled, it's time to add the scarf-like front drape. Here's how:

- Measure the desired length for the front drape and select the number of motifs needed to achieve that length.
- 2. Sew these motifs together in a straight line, attaching them to one side of the cardigan front.
- 3. Repeat Step 2 for the other side of the cardigan front.

Note: The length and width of the front drape can be adjusted according to your preference.



#### **Finishing Touches**

After completing the cardigan sweater with the scarf-like front drape, make sure to secure all loose ends by weaving them in with a tapestry needle. Give your creation a gentle block by dampening it with water and shaping it to the desired measurements. Allow it to air dry, and then your crochet motif pattern for the lace back cardigan sweater with scarf-like front drape is complete! Congratulations on completing this beautiful crochet project! 
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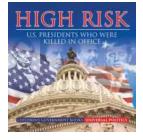
A crochet motif pattern by contemporary artist & designer Kristen Stein. The pattern uses basic crochet skills and fingering weight yarn to create a lightweight cardigan sweater with lace details on the back and a scarf-like drape in the front. The cardigan is written as a 'one-size-fits most' pattern. It is open styling with significant drape in front and fitted across the back to show off the lacy details. The back shoulder-to-shoulder measures approximately 16"(42cm)-18"(45cm) unstretched. To increase the overall size of the cardigan and add extra drape to the back, you can add an extra column of motifs in the center back or use a larger crochet hook and/or thicker DK-weight yarn to create larger motifs. From shoulder to base, the cardigan measures 30"(75cm) in length. The total perimeter width is about 52"(130cm) with about 20"-24"(50cm-60cm) across the back from side-to-side with the extra drape in front. The scarf-like neckline is a

total of 10"(25cm) wide and folds over to about 5"(12.5cm) wide. The sleeves are ribbed with extra lace detail around the wrist.



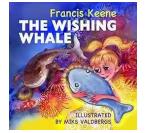
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
