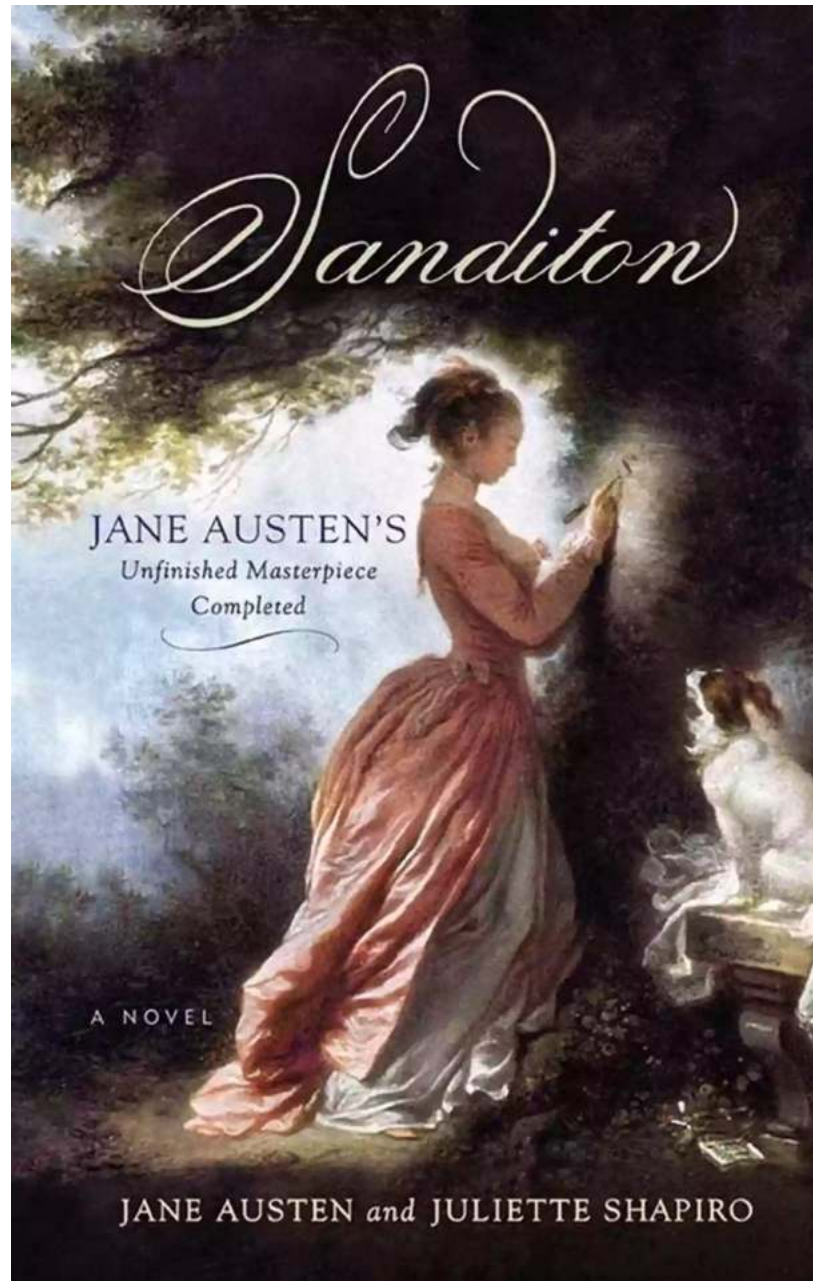


Sanditon: The Unfinished Masterpiece by Jane Austen

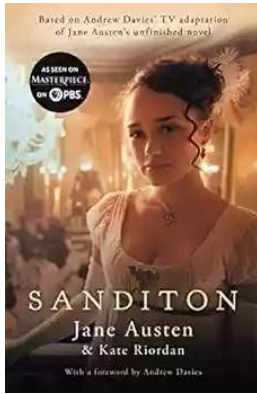
