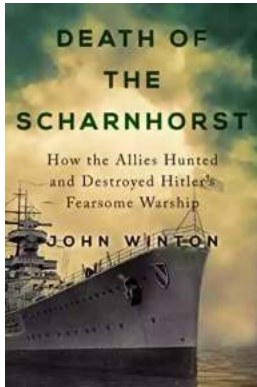

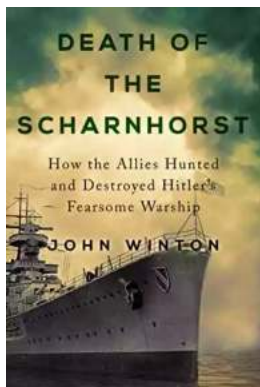

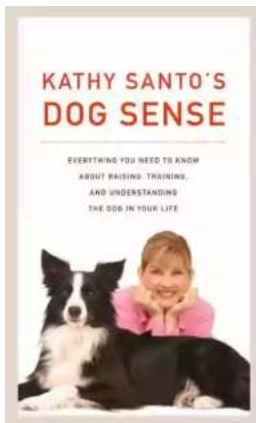

The Scharnhorst was a state of the art capital ship of Nazi Germany's navy.
