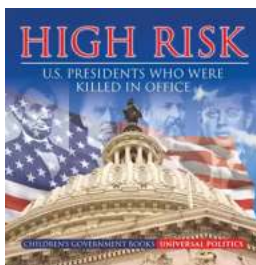
veterans, and how their lives have been forever changed and even saved since adopting canines.

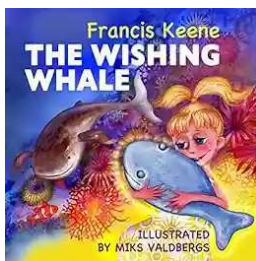
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
