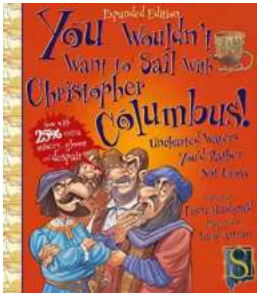


The Dark Side of Christopher Columbus

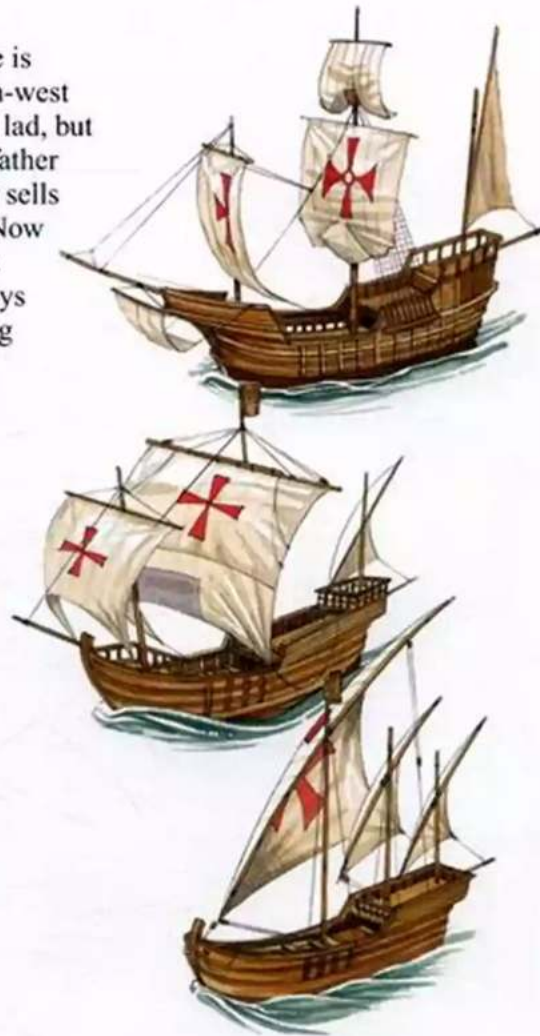

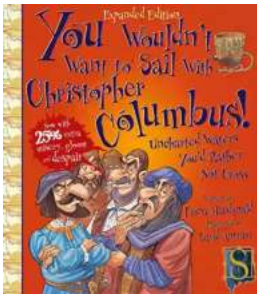
